CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Larry Zimmerman called the February 8, 2006 meeting to order at 7 PM and opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Attending were Supervisors Zimmerman, Allen Aungst, Judith Lehman and Jerry Wise. Supervisor Herm Clemens was absent. Also present were Solicitor Gino DiNicola, Sect. / Treas. Kathy Ferguson, John Heinbach, Clinton Koontz, Lynn Johnson, Ray Stump, Lee Zimmerman, Donald Wenrich, Diane Tobin, John Stahl, Bert Witmer, Bobby Milligan, Larry Brindle, Joan Schwer, other residents; list on file.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS - Kathy Ferguson said she would like to comment after Mr. Koontz speaks about the office personnel.

MINUTES / FINANCIAL ITEMS

- ♦ **Meeting Minutes** – January meeting minutes were not available for the Board.
- ♦ **Treasurer’s Report** - Zimmerman said the General Fund beginning balance was \$168,190.79, the January General Fund receipts were \$31,527.21, January General Fund expenses were \$42,051.61 and the ending balance of the General Fund is \$157,666.39. Zimmerman said the Combined Township Fund ending balance is \$2,198,283.89. Aungst moved to approve the Treasurer’s Report, Wise seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **Approval of Bills** – Wise moved to approve paying the bills totaling \$31,656.70; Lehman seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.

PERSONS TO BE HEARD

Clinton Koontz – Office Personnel – Zimmerman asked Koontz if it is something that should be taken into executive session and Koontz said it would be a good idea. DiNicola said it is up to the Board if they want to discuss personnel matters in executive session and he recommends they do so with the interested persons who they choose. DiNicola asked Koontz if he had a problem with deferring the executive session until later in the meeting; Koontz said no. DiNicola said Ferguson wanted to comment and asked if she had a problem with deferring until later on in the meeting following the executive session, Ferguson said no. Zimmerman said the executive session would be held after other items were taken care of.

Clinton Koontz – HMI Hours – Zimmerman asked Koontz what this involves and Koontz said this does not involve a person or possible litigation, it is strictly a position. Zimmerman gave Koontz the floor. Koontz said in the monthly report from the HMI the landfill closed in October of 2004; at the reorganization meeting the HMI requested an additional year at forty hours a week to catch up on paperwork. Koontz said he looked up the law concerning the HMI, there is only one monthly report required to be submitted to DEP. Koontz said as a resident he wants to know what paperwork we took eighteen months to catch up on, he would like that accountability. Koontz said state law only requires a monthly summary and travel log be submitted by an HMI and they don’t even care what is written on it, they only use it as paper proof that the person was on the job and that documentation be submitted to the state for reimbursement to the municipality.

Lehman asked where he found it was stated about catching up on paperwork. Koontz said in the Pennsylvania Code, and then said in the minutes of the reorganization meeting from last year. Lehman said there were other reasons given in the executive session, not just paperwork.

Clinton Koontz – HMI Hours, cont.

Lehman said as far as the law with the DEP that he is trying to quote, it is up to the Township to decide how many hours she can put in, not DEP. Koontz asked, if by law we only need a monthly report, what we are doing for twenty hours a week. Koontz said he feels too much time was spent at the landfill after they stopped receiving trash and disagreed with Lehman when she mentioned the value of the training she received through Waste Management saying she doesn't work for them and the HMI position belongs to the municipality. Lehman agreed she is a municipal employee and takes any training she can get from DEP or on the job.

Koontz asked if there were any municipal requirements and said Lehman does not need to learn Waste Management's jobs. Lehman asked if he was fine with them watching the gas and leachate. Koontz said he is fine with not spending the money for twenty hours a week when the only thing that needs to be done is a couple of spot inspections and a monthly report. Koontz said they even have forms to use if you don't generate a local form. Lehman said those forms came from some of her inspections; that is how they developed that form, call Michael Texter of the HMI program.

Zimmerman said if Koontz has anymore information he would like to share with one or any of the supervisors, they can check into what he is saying and they as a Board would have to determine what they should do.

REPORTS

Engineers Report / Planning Commission Report

- ♦ **Paradise Manor Phase III Request for Planning Waiver** – Zimmerman asked Lynn Johnson if the items were taken care of and Johnson said the deed was needed. Ferguson said Mr. Daubert came in and copies of the deed were taken from an earlier phase of the plan and are now included with this plan. Zimmerman said the Planning Commission had waived the location map scale, the non-building declaration and a waiver for showing the tract map on the same page as the proposed subdivision. Ferguson said DEP needs to approve the Planning Waiver, which is what is on the Board's agenda. Zimmerman moved to approve the request for the Planning Waiver for Paradise Manor Phase III and send it to DEP, Aungst seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **Olesh Lot #1 Sketch Plan of Record** – Aungst moved to approve the Olesh Lot #1 Sketch Plan of Record, Wise seconded the motion, all were in favor; motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **Lengel Lot #8 Sketch Plan of Record** – Aungst moved to approve the Lengel Lot #8 Sketch Plan of Record, Wise seconded the motion, all were in favor; motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **Brandt to Fish & Game Request for Planning Waiver** – Zimmerman said this was tabled last month because he thought it was the first lot at the end of town, but it is not, there are two separate lots. Zimmerman moved to approve the Brandt Planning Waiver, Lehman seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **John Mindermann Resignation** – Zimmerman moved to regretfully accept the resignation of John Mindermann from the Planning Commission, Lehman seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0. Aungst moved to send Mindermann a letter on behalf of the supervisors thanking him for his contribution to the Township, Wise seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **Planning Commission Appointment** – Zimmerman said in January there was an application submitted for the Planning Commission and after review of the application Zimmerman asked Ray Stump if he was still interested; Stump said yes. Zimmerman moved to appoint Ray Stump to complete Mindermann's term from March 1, 2006 to January, 2009. Lehman seconded the motion.

Planning Commission Appointment, cont.

Larry Brindle asked how they can accept a resignation tonight and appoint someone else for a position that was not advertised. Zimmerman said technically it doesn't have to be advertised and Stump had volunteered months ago.

Zimmerman called for the vote on the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.

- ♦ **Township Planning Association membership request** – Lynn Johnson said Ferguson had given them information on the Planning Association and would like the Board to consider allowing them to become a member. Ferguson said the Township Planning Association is through PSATS and a membership for the Planning Commission would cost \$105 annually and explained the program to the Board. Aungst moved to approve a membership for the Planning Commission in the PSATS Township Planning Association, Wise seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ **Planning Commission Secretary** – Johnson said no one on the Planning Commission is willing to take John Mindermann's place as secretary at this time. Johnson said the engineer won't be at the March meeting, but Dave said he could take notes for future meetings. Johnson said in the past office staff had been at their meeting and did the secretary work. Johnson said one idea was if they hire another secretary they could possibly be the secretary for the Planning Commission and also the Zoning Hearing Board.

Wise asked if the Planning Commission records their meeting and Johnson said no, but if they did, you would still need someone transcribe it. Wise said it would be a temporary thing and at least all the information would be recorded. Johnson said their secretary makes the agenda in conjunction with Ferguson.

Zimmerman said Johnson is correct, the office secretary at one time did the work at the Planning Commission and Zoning Hearing Board meetings, then they tried paying extra to a secretary on each Board and that is not working. Zimmerman said we as a Board have to decide how we are going to handle this, there is a problem and we have to correct it. Zimmerman said there is a part time office position coming up and asked the boards to bear with them for a month or so, they will work on this.

Landfill Inspector – Wise asked Lehman about the situation at the landfill when she was at her twenty hours and sent him an email. Lehman noted the ammonia was high and they were not sending effluent to treatment plant; she was concerned about the storage capacity of the leachate because of the amount of rainfall we received. Lehman said things were fine and she didn't go out on Sunday

Wise asked when the numbers were increasing on the report if that meant there was a leak in the liner. Lehman said it is not a leak, it is where the cap and the liner come together and is not fused, if there is a pooling it can come into the landfill where the waste is stored, it is up to Waste Management to treat it as leachate, it is a costly factor, but DEP said they don't have to repair it at this point.

Aungst asked about the letter for training for Judy and if it is a full day program. Lee Zimmerman said the additional training for their treatment plant operator is on-going and sometimes half days, but not on a fixed schedule, they extended the invitation to Judy to sit in on the training; the trainer is certified by DEP. Lehman said the more she knows about the plant the better an inspector she can be.

Aungst asked if the reason for extra hours was the increased ammonia levels. Lehman said yes, because of the ammonia level they could not ship effluent out to the plant, so they had to store it in their storage area. Aungst asked why it was not in her report, Lehman said sorry.

Roadmaster – No comments.

Zoning Officer – Aungst asked if the two complaints were resolved. Koontz said one was and showed the Board a written complaint asking them for a motion to have action on sending the landowner a letter concerning the complaint. Aungst asked if it is recent and Koontz said he hasn't ascertained that yet, he is 99% sure that it is in the last four or five years. Aungst said we need to check to make sure.

Koontz said he received a floodplain management activities report from the secretary that goes to the Commonwealth; he completed it but hasn't received a copy of the sealed document. Koontz asked the Board if they knew about the DCED report, the two additions are the ones he has documentation for, the sewage plant and the bridge at the lake. Koontz said the FEMA document is complete and needs to be mailed in, the one Aungst brought to his attention.

Zoning Boundary Change Request from Arthur Aungst - Koontz said it is the same type situation that was noted for the record last month; in our ordinance there is a provision if a district line crosses a person's property that had ownership when the ordinance was adopted, they can move the line one time only fifty feet in whatever direction they desire. Koontz said we received a letter from Zane, Zane & Rossi, he sees nothing wrong with it, they need to acknowledge receipt of it and it is on file in the zoning office.

Zimmerman asked if he needs action on the first item and Koontz said let him look into it further.

Lehman asked if the Board requires any records of the phone calls the Zoning Officer lists and Zimmerman said they have not required any records of phone calls.

Aungst gave Ferguson the floodplain update report to file and send a copy in. Ferguson questioned the date on the report saying it was for 2003 and 2004. Aungst said it is for a prior year, she had given it to him in November and he had said he would check with Koontz.

OLD BUSINESS

Part Time Office Position – Ferguson said we received three applications; she had not scheduled any interviews because she didn't have a pay rate to offer because they had not included the rate in their motion to advertise. Aungst moved to approve the part time office position rate at \$10 per hour, Wise seconded the motion, all were in favor; motion carried 4 to 0.

Zimmerman moved to advertise the position one time in the Sunday edition of the Pottsville paper. Lehman asked if they had looked at the employee handbook on the selection process for employment, she noted that it states they do not have to advertise for a job that is to be filled by the transfer or promoting of a current township employee. Aungst seconded the motion. Zimmerman, Aungst, Wise voted in favor, Lehman opposed the motion, motion carried 3 to 1.

Permit Fees from Municipalities - Zimmerman dismissed this item without discussion.

Road Inspection Zimmerman said it was not held as planned because the newspaper did not run the advertisement. After discussion, Zimmerman moved to advertise the road inspection for February 25, 2006 at 9 AM, Aungst seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.

Truck for Sale – Zimmerman said the person he had an offer from changed their mind and doesn't want it. Lehman said she got information on a place in Lancaster that might make an offer. Aungst moved to advertise the truck on eBay again if we don't receive an offer from a local source, Zimmerman seconded the motion, all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.

Wenrich Motion from January 11th Meeting – DiNicola said he reviewed Mr. Wenrich's request to have the motions made by Chairman Zimmerman on January 3rd be expunged from the minutes. DiNicola said it is his understanding that Wenrich is insisting on strict adherence to parliamentary procedure set forth in Robert's Rules of Order but the Board has never formally adopted Robert's Rules of Order. DiNicola said all motions made are typically made by the Board, so to entertain a motion from the public in general is ordinarily not recognized. DiNicola said with respect to Wenrich's motion, he would advise the Board to take no action on it; he feels the original motion would withstand judicial scrutiny.

Wenrich said he is not challenging the Board's authority to do what they wanted with the hours, but he was challenging the procedure. Wenrich said as a citizen he has a right under the Constitution to petition the government for redress of grievances; the Sunshine Law confirms the Constitution. Wenrich said he had the right to make the motion when Zimmerman gave him the floor; what they should have done was vote him down rather than Larry blowing his stack. Wenrich said he used Robert's Rules of Order because there are no established rules for this Board and a member mentioned he thought they went by Robert's Rules of Order.

Zimmerman said we are not here for debate and asked if he had any other comment.

Wenrich asked him to read the motion, he said there was no motion to reduce the hours from forty to twenty. Aungst said there certainly was and Wenrich disagreed, offering to read it to him. Aungst said then it was missed in the minutes. Wenrich said the minutes are official; you accepted these and insisted they read Zimmerman's motion. Aungst said he would like to listen to the tape.

Zimmerman said he doesn't have to; he will make a new motion right now. Zimmerman said he moves to change the hours of full time – Wise interrupted and asked if a motion like that made now would require them to pay back hours. Aungst and Zimmerman said no. Aungst asked Ferguson what hours she has been putting down for Lehman and Ferguson said what is on her time card, twenty hours. Zimmerman said he will just make the motion again and that will clear everything up.

DiNicola said he thinks the request from Wenrich is for the Board to clarify the matter, the more prudent course of action is to give it some thought and put it on next month's agenda.

Zimmerman tabled the matter of Mr. Wenrich's motion until next month.

NEW BUSINESS

Investment Account – Aungst said Sovereign bank had the highest interest rates for 12 months as compared to Lebanon Valley and PLGIT. Aungst moved to place one million two hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000.00) in an account with a fixed rate of 5.05% at Sovereign Bank through December 31, 2006. Zimmerman seconded the motion; all were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.

EMS Tax (Fire Companies) – Zimmerman said over the past years we received money as host fees from the landfill and we had an agreement with the fire companies to give them money from the landfill host fees. Zimmerman said we are not receiving any host fees anymore and he would like the solicitor to write something informing both fire companies in the Township that agreement be stricken legally or made void because the landfill is not receiving any trash. Zimmerman said the EMS Tax was put in place by this Board to compensate for that a little bit, it won't be as much as it was before, but that is why the tax was put in place. Zimmerman said the only reason he finds this necessary is because the fire company brought their lawyer along to a meeting to stress to us about these agreements.

Lehman asked if all of the EMS Tax will be going to the fire companies. Zimmerman said they will have to discuss that, he is just trying to get rid of this agreement. Aungst said \$20,000 from the EMS Tax is already in the budget for the fire companies.

EMS Tax (Fire Companies) cont.

Zimmerman moved to officially notify the fire companies of the termination of the Memorandum of Understanding agreement from January of 1997 and any other agreement that exists relating to host fees paid to the fire companies.

Bert Witmer asked if the landfill re-opens will the fire company have to renegotiate and Zimmerman said yes. Bobby Milligan asked if it has to be renegotiated with the Township or can it be built right into the agreement to come directly from the landfill. Zimmerman said it has to come directly from the Township because we have control issues with that money, but they would definitely have the opportunity to renegotiate.

Wise seconded the motion. Zimmerman, Aungst, Wise voted in favor of the motion, Lehman opposed the motion, motion carried 3 to 1.

Fire Companies – Zimmerman said he understands the tanker has been sold and asked if the engine was sold. Milligan said they are looking into replacing it. Zimmerman said he heard rumors to that effect; we had an issue here several months ago and there has been no talk between the fire companies about the run cards. Zimmerman said that is when Ravine brought their lawyer in here and said our agreement states Ravine is the primary responder for a fire. Zimmerman said he is asking the Board to send a letter to Ravine putting them on notice that it is possible we might change that agreement. Zimmerman said the reason is the Township has donated almost a half million dollars to Ravine Fire Company and they are selling fire equipment without letting the Township know about it; they are supposed to be our primary responder and we don't know what is going on. Zimmerman moved to send a letter to Ravine Fire Company that we want a meeting with them to re-work the agreement.

Discussion on which agreement it was followed with DiNicola noting it was the agreement for fire protection and medical emergency services dated July 1st of 1987, between the Township and Ravine, designating Ravine the primary responder.

Zimmerman said he is not saying he wants to terminate this agreement; he wants the notice there so they don't have to go through the ninety day process.

Milligan asked who they would be meeting with and Zimmerman said him and Wise, they are on the fire company committee.

Larry Brindle asked if it means they are usurping control of where they cover. Zimmerman said right now the fire companies determine where they run, his concern is if they are selling equipment and not letting us know, the Board is responsible for fire coverage in the Township. Zimmerman and Milligan discussed rumors of Ravine getting rid of their engine and what had been done with the run cards since the last meeting.

Zimmerman asked if the three closest are dispatched now and Milligan said yes, it took a long time to redo the run cards, but sometimes the County is still dispatching them wrong. Zimmerman said they hadn't heard that it was done.

Lehman asked if the Board hasn't considered meeting with fire company on these issues on an annual or quarterly basis. Wise said their committee met with them on a quarterly basis last year. Lehman asked if they are going to do that this year also. Wise said they would like to keep the meetings going, that is where this request for this letter and the meeting is coming from, there is a time since the last official meeting. Milligan said they should specify a date. Zimmerman and Wise decided on a date of March 2nd at 7 PM at the Township building.

Zimmerman amended his motion to have the Solicitor send the Ravine Fire Company a letter including the meeting on March 2nd at 7 PM and putting them on notice of possible changes of our agreement, Wise seconded the motion. All were in favor and motion carried 4 to 0.

CORRESPONDENCE

Application for Auditor – Zimmerman said there were applications for auditor in the correspondence folder, one is needed. After review of the two applications, Aungst moved to appoint Donna Reilly to fill the vacant seat for the term ending in January of 2010, Wise seconded the motion. Aungst, Wise, Zimmerman voted in favor, Lehman opposed the motion, motion carried 3 to 1.

Zoning Hearing Board – Zimmerman said the Zoning Hearing Board needs a person and he wants it put on for next month. Aungst said they don't need one. Brindle said as a result of the meeting with Zimmerman and Clemens, some of the members had suggested they increase the Zoning Hearing Board from three members to five members.

Aungst said there are two alternates. Brindle said one of the alternates has not been available for the last seven years because of health. Brindle said at their reorganization meeting all members declined the secretary position. Brindle said the Zoning Hearing Board took no action to petition the Township Board of Supervisors to increase their members to five; it was a suggestion off the record. Zimmerman said he is bringing it to this Board's attention so they can consider what their opinion would be and have it put on next month's agenda.

Diane Tobin asked if the alternates had received notice of the public hearings and Brindle said he was not secretary so he could not tell her that. Tobin said she didn't believe they did, so how could he know if they could attend or not. Koontz asked how she knew they didn't and Brindle asked if she was an alternate. Tobin said she had been on the Board of Supervisors. Brindle asked if she had been privy to the information that was disseminated to the Zoning Hearing Board members and alternates and asked if she is qualified to make that statement; Tobin said yes.

Zoning Boundary Change Request from Arthur Aungst – Zimmerman asked Koontz if any action was needed on that and Koontz said no.

Appointment to Joint Treatment Authority Board – Zimmerman read part of a letter from John Stahl stating the Township utilizes more EDU's than the Borough; therefore the Township is entitled to appoint the third member to the Joint Treatment Authority Board. Zimmerman said since this letter was only received on February 3rd, he would ask they table this until next month and put it on the agenda so they can look for someone.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- ♦ Tobin asked Koontz where in the ordinance to find the one time change section. Koontz looked it up and told her it was Section 302, district boundaries rules for interpretation, item 8.
- ♦ Tobin commented as a resident she doesn't see how you can justify reducing the HMI to twenty hours when the only thing that has changed is there are no trucks coming in, but watching the trash is definitely not the job, there is more to it than that.
- ♦ Tobin reported the Township website had 7,442 pages viewed.
- ♦ Clinton Koontz appealed to Clemens (not present) to rescind his attack on Donna Chamberlain's reputation at the last meeting over something he was totally misinformed about. Koontz discussed an email he said that comes to the Zoning Hearing Board and to the Township Secretary with an instruction sheet stating it is a half hour to forty five minutes of work. Koontz said he doesn't know how you are going to get people to volunteer to do anything around here when someone just takes off halfcocked without all the information and assaults someone's reputation; which gets put in the paper and then the explanation is not even offered of the investigation of it. Koontz said this really upsets him, these are unpaid people and the assertions made by Clemens that appeared in the paper were completely untrue.

Lehman asked if he has documentation that they were untrue. Koontz said "I just said that!" and said "Why don't you pay attention, you ask what after everything!" Koontz said "Here it is, it is the email, she had the copy when she apparently told Mr. Clemens about it". Lehman said "I think you are very disrespectful." Koontz said he is not the one who made comments about someone's reputation, that was disrespectful.

- ♦ Aungst questioned the Citizen Standard newspaper representative about the article that appeared, he doesn't think they were accurate numbers; it said the Township currently pays less than \$6 per hour toward the HMI salary, the remainder picked up by a grant from DEP. Aungst said last year her gross pay was \$37,960, if you divide that in half since DEP pays half, when you calculate that it comes to \$9.12 per hour. Aungst said that is not her current salary, current salary is what she is paid today, Joan Schwer agreed. Aungst said he thinks those things in the newspaper mislead the public and create more animosity within the community.
- ♦ Aungst said it is a year since the new heating system was installed and Hlavaty's said an inspection would cost about \$125. Aungst moved to approve Hlavaty's doing an inspection of the heating system, Zimmerman seconded the motion, all were in favor; motion carried 4 to 0.
- ♦ Ferguson asked the Board to clarify what the HMI rate of compensation is when she works over twenty hours in a week, weekends or emergencies. Aungst and Zimmerman said it should be straight time.
- ♦ Ferguson asked the Board if they received the email on the unemployment claim for Lehman and asked if they wished to respond, the Board said they received the email but did not want to respond.

Executive Session – At 9:06 PM the Board of Supervisors and Solicitor DiNicola went into executive session on personnel matters. Later the Board asked Clinton Koontz to join the executive session and later asked Kathy Ferguson to join the executive session with Koontz. Ferguson refused to enter the executive session with Koontz. Koontz left the executive session and Ferguson entered. Ferguson left the executive session and Sallie Deichert was asked to into the executive session. Deichert left the executive session and Koontz rejoined the executive session.

The meeting resumed at 12:06 AM.

Solicitor DiNicola said the Board is going to continue this matter in progress with another meeting to be scheduled and advertised for Monday, February 13th at 6 PM for the purpose of the Board to render, if necessary, a final decision on the grievances that were filed. DiNicola said the persons who filed the grievances should know that they have the right and he is asking they consider withdrawing without prejudice to re-file, to allow the grievance process to do what it's meant to do and to conciliate and resolve these matters amicably. DiNicola said he strongly recommends they consider doing that, but if not, a decision is expected to be rendered by the Board on the matter, in which there may be possible further action on February 13th at 6 PM. DiNicola added that between now and then the Board should consider the possible of any and all disciplinary measures or actions that they can take if necessary on the grievances.
